Our School Improvement Plan Goals

Goal #1: The goal at Bay View Elementary is to increase performance in **READING** as measured by the grade level state WASL assessment (3-8th grades) and/or DIBELS fluency tests (grades K-5) by:

- a) decreasing the number of students at level 1/2 by 25% at each grade level
- b) increasing the percentage of students passing the reading assessment by 10% each year at each grade level

Goal #2: The goal at Bay View Elementary is to increase proficiency in **MATH** as measured by the grade level state WASL assessments (3-8th grades):

- a) decreasing the number of students at level 1/2 by 25% at each grade level
- b) increasing the percentage of students passing the math state assessment by 10% each year at each grade level

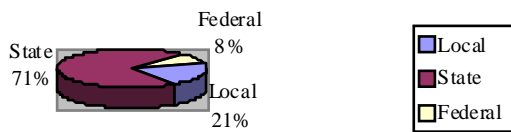


Our School Building

Bay View Elementary was opened in 1992. The school is a wonderful facility that offers students in Kindergarten through 8th grade many opportunities. Bay View has a large gymnasium, library, computer lab, and music room. The outdoor facilities include a covered play area, play equipment and large playfields. Eight portable classrooms have been added to the campus to accommodate the growth in Burlington-Edison School district. The 6/7/8 grade program is located on this new part of the campus and has a new science lab, 30 computers, audio enhanced classrooms with video projectors and one SMART board.
