

Transgender Students

The district is required to provide an educational environment that is safe and free of discrimination for all students, regardless of sex, sexual orientation, gender identity or gender expression. In order to provide these students with an equal opportunity for learning and achievement, the board directs the superintendent to develop procedures so that all schools have a common approach toward transgender students with regard to official records, confidential health and education information, communication, restroom and locker room accessibility, sports and physical education, dress codes and other school activities. Such procedures shall be in accordance with local, state and federal laws concerning harassment, intimidation, bullying and discrimination, and will consider the welfare of all students when implemented.
